SLEEP EASY

It will be at least two more years before midtown Manhattan has its first green-from-the-ground-up hotel (Starwood's "1" Hotel and Residences is scheduled to open on Sixth Avenue, across from Bryant Park, in 2010). But many high-end hoteliers are already taking an eco-friendly approach to luxury and comfort. Kimpton Hotels, owners of The Muse (bottom, left and right) and 70 Park Avenue, educates all staff members in a 22-point list of EarthCare Standards. Little things like low-flow water systems, energy-efficient lighting, non-chemical cleaning of guestrooms, organic snacks in the minibars, and soaps, shampoos, and conditioners produced by environmentally responsible companies help the hotelier's green-minded guests sleep with a clear conscience.
